

PC Honors the Resilient Class of 2025 at 97th Commencement



A wave of excitement and pride swept through Jamison Stadium on Friday night as Porterville College celebrated its 97th Commencement Ceremony, honoring the remarkable achievements of the Class of 2025. Over 400 graduates marked the culmination of their hard work and dedication, ready to embark on new chapters in their lives.

The evening air buzzed with anticipation long before the 7 p.m. start, as families and friends eagerly secured their spots, ready to cheer on their loved ones. The ceremony commenced with a procession of the graduating class, their faces alight with a mixture of joy and accomplishment.
